Using Colours that dogs see can (blue, purple, yellow, black) help

Human Sees....



Dog Sees....



Blue, purple and yellow equipment is easy for the dog to see and the dog sees something similar to what humans see



Visibility of poles helped by blue stripes and plenty of visible white i.e. not too much taping

Blue, Black, Purple and Yellow Equipment is GREAT since these colours usually contrast against the background or footing IN THE EYES OF THE DOG

Green poles against green grass renders the poles invisible, especially given the large amount of green tape used on the poles. Blue lightly taped poles would have solved the problem



Pink and orange are seen as grey - it is hard to distinguish the obstacles against orange background fencing.. Blue lightly taped poles would have solved the problem

Green, red, pink, orange, brown equipment is not a good choice and can be unsafe since these colours do not contrast against the background or footing **IN THE EYES OF THE DOG**

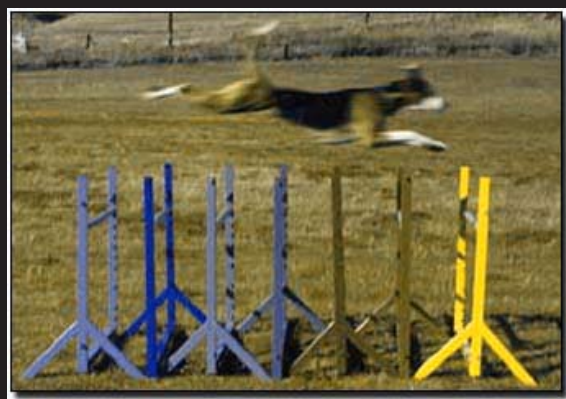
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Human Sees....

Red jumps are quite hard to see.



Blue Contacts highly are visible to dog against green grass and orange fencing

Red DW is hard to see against grass and tree/hedge backdrop



Red bars and AF hard to see against dirt . AF contrasts nicely to white perimeter fence though.
